2. REPORT OF THE CHIEF ACADEMIC OFFICER Enclosure

Provost Wolfe provided a detailed overview of URI's Fall Enrollment figures (<u>link to</u> <u>enrollment slides</u>.) She announced to the committee that URI has a newly hired Dean of the College of Pharmacy, Dr. Kerry LaPlante. Additionally, she informed the committee about the proposed Fall Commencement ceremony, planned for December 2023.

3. REPORT OF THE CHIEF RESEARCH OFFICER

Interim Vice President for Research for Economic Development Bethany Jenkins discussed Southeast New England's new EDA Ocean Tech Hub led by RI Commerce, and partnering with state government, regional university partners and communities to support this effort. In addition, she discussed URI's strengths in the area of offshore wind and opportunities to grow these strengths. She also discussed other opportunities to grow research funding, particularly by aligning priorities in the Division of Research and Economic Development with University Strategic Priorities and how we can pursue economic development opportunities for research funding and partnerships.
